## How long is the appointment?

• 1.5-2 hours

# Is there any food/fluid restrictions?

• No

## Can I take my oral medications?

- Some medications can reduce your skin's reactivity and should be held for a week prior to testing. See below for some examples:
  - o Antihistamines for allergy/sleep aid
    - Diphenhydramine (Benadryl, Unisom, Zzzquil)
    - Cetirizine (Reactine)
    - Loratadine (Claritine)
  - o Over-the-counter H2 blocker for heartburn
    - Ranitidine (Zantac)
    - Famotidine (Pepcid)
  - Prescription morning sickness medication
    - Doxylamine (Diclectin)

## Can I use my topical medications?

- Topical steroids would reduce the skin's reactivity. Application to areas other than the forearms is fine and would not affect the skin test.
  - Betamethasone, clobetasone, hydrocortisone
